

Pastor's Letter

"There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens..."

Ecclesiastes 3:1

Melinda Garza Moran has joined the staff of St. Mark's for a one-year internship. Melinda is a Master of Divinity (Justice and Reconciliation concentration) student at Luther Seminary in Saint Paul, MN, and is a candidate for Word and Sacrament ministry in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) with the Southern Ohio Synod. She received a Bachelor of Science degree in 2019 from Central Michigan University with a major in Leadership.

Melinda relocated from Southwest Ohio where she worked full-time as the Income Tax Administrator for the City of Monroe. She was responsible for the day-to-day operations of the city's municipal income tax collections. She also led a staff of five employees.

She served her home church Prince of Peace in a variety of roles: as a Council Member, on the Women's Ministry Steering Committee, Welcome Team leader, and on the Prayer Team. Melinda also had the honor and privilege to go on a mission to Haiti with her church and The Haitian Timoun Foundation (HTF) in the summer of 2018. It was during that mission trip that she witnessed the uniqueness of God's beautiful creation as she taught and worshipped with children and adults from different racial and ethnic backgrounds, with various abilities and beliefs. The language and cultural barriers did not restrict the power of the Holy Spirit that flowed through the people and experiences that summer.

Melinda's religious background is as diverse as her family structure. She grew up as a Catholic and then began attending a non-denominational (Pentecostal-based) church at the age of 18. Melinda raised her children in that congregation until she visited an ELCA church in 2012. The ELCA denomination brought together the best of both worlds — tradition and evangelism. The extra gift that the ELCA gave her was the message of Grace and Love through the work of Mission to the Body of Christ.

Grace, love, and mission are core values of the work that Melinda has done in her advocacy work with the LGBTQIA+ community and the church. Her passion is to educate and remove barriers between the two communities. As a parent of Queer children, she knows very well the hurt and pain that the church has done to the LGBTQIA+ community. Melinda deeply believes that we are all created in the beautiful image of God as our authentic selves. This is the truth that she seeks to share in ministry!

Melinda grew up in Michigan and moved to Ohio in 2017 after the birth of her first grandson. She is extremely blessed with two adult children Eli and Alyssa. Alyssa lives in Ohio with her husband AJ and their sons Abbott and Arelio. Eli lives in Michigan with his fiancé Andrew.



St. Mark's watercolor (and more media) groups begin Wednesday, October 4, at 1:00 p.m. or Saturday, October 7, at 10:00 a.m. Here are a few things to know:

Schedule: Watercolor is offered at two different times: Wednesdays at 1:00 p.m. and Saturdays at 10:00 a.m. You can switch sessions as your schedule requires. Watercolor is offered weekly, except for holidays, until February (date to be determined).

Experience: No experience necessary. We welcome returning creators and newcomers.

Materials: We provide newcomers with materials to get them started, including a pan set of Kuretake watercolors, basic watercolor brushes, a plastic mixing palette, and watercolor paper. Returning painters—If you need to replenish supplies, contact Ann McGovern. Bulk orders earn a discount.

Activities: We will nurture and expand creativity in several areas, including watercolor, acrylics, neurographics and hand-made books. An example of a hand-made book is shown here. It was made by a Rapid City artist, Camille Riner.

Guides and Teachers: Ann McGovern, Joan Haagenson, Sally Turner. One of the gifts of the earlier groups has been the help, sharing, guidance, support and affirmation provided to each other.



Gallery: We will host a "gallery showing" of your work some time in early February 2024.

How to sign up: Please contact Ann McGovern, 605-370-9072, with questions or concerns or to sign up. You can also sign up through the office. Let us know which session, Wednesdays or Saturdays, will work for you. We ask that you sign up at least one week before the first session to allow time for purchasing materials.

President's report – The Pie and Ice Cream night was a hit; around 200 people attended. There were many more families with kids this year than last year.

Pastor's report – The intern's house is ready. She'll be here August 18. Housing is from Bethany, so we will share Melinda's time with them, like we did with Vicar Lynn and Vicar Leif.

Vicar's report – Thank you all for a wonderful year. He couldn't think of a better place to learn and grow!

Committee Reports

Property – They have two bids back on the roof. Both are to fix, not replace, the current roof. One is from the company that put the current roof on the fellowship hall.

Kut and Kill is going to seed again at their expense.

Congregational Well-being – They will be sending gifts to first year college students soon. They will also be putting frozen meals together on August 26 from 10:00 a.m. to noon.

Mission – The RIC task force presented a draft of an inclusive St. Mark's wedding policy. MSC. An inclusive call policy was presented as well. MSC.

Youth – They were supposed to go to Wild Water West in July, but it rained, so they went to a movie instead.

Christian Education – They had a workday where five people worked eight hours getting ready for the year and they are still not done. They are working on a curriculum that is solid, organized, and effective. They will be handing out Bibles in September to all kids who may have missed them. They have a service project in October at Bethany singing to the residents. The semester calendar will be available at the beginning of the Sunday school year. The kids will be more visible in church.

WE NEED TEACHERS. We teach three classes: pre-school through kindergarten, first through fourth or fifth grade, and fifth grade through middle school. Fifth grade students will be given the choice of staying with the younger students or moving up with the middle school students. Teachers can sign up for one Sunday, which consists of 30 minutes of teaching. Everything you need to teach the class will be provided for you and you will never be alone in the classroom. There will always be another adult in the room with you.
