Dear friends in Christ,

Grace and peace to you in the name of the One in whom we are waiting for: Jesus the Christ.

Advent is my favorite church season. I think it is fitting that the new liturgical year begins with Advent because the church begins by being counter-cultural to the rest of the world. Many of us get to the last month of the calendar year and rush to complete things before the new year starts on January 1. But, in the church, we *begin again* by slowing down, waiting, and preparing to receive Christ, the messenger who announces peace and brings good news, into our hearts and into our homes.

Advent is also a reminder of how we live in the "already and not yet." We live in a world knowing that Jesus has already come, and yet we are waiting for the return of Christ. We wait for there to be peace among nations, for every hungry soul to be fed, for wars to cease, and for all children of God to be one with each other. So while we wait and prepare, we recognize that the world is weary, and yet we find ways to rejoice by seeing the image of God on the faces of those we see as we go about our daily lives.

And yet, the Good News that Jesus came into the world *for us* continues to be proclaimed in the same story that has been shared for over 2000 years. Because of that Good News, our weary world rejoices.



We have made and donated 150 quilts to organizations around Sioux Falls and South Dakota. 

cost is \$27.00 per hymnal.





Worship and Music – They are decorating the church for Christmas on December 2.

Old Business - No old business.
