Papa I love you

Felix Carrier-Damon made the news recently for a simple act of love.

Felix hit two home runs, including a grand slam, in a baseball game on July 30. He was able to keep both baseballs after the game. To sign the balls and commemorate his big day, he wrote, "best feeling ever" on the first ball. For the second one, the grand slam ball, he wrote, "Papa, I love you," and gave it to his grandfather, Bruce Carrier.


Melissa, Felix's mom and the Carriers' youngest daughter, filmed that moment between grandfather and grandson and posted it on Instagram.

The reaction has been unexpected and incredible.

Hundreds of media outlets have featured the viral video, with dozens of networks interviewing the Carrier family directly to share their inspiring story. Tens of millions of people have viewed it and responded online. The owners of the New York Mets sent a complete care package to the family, full of merchandise and collectibles, including a ball for Felix signed by the entire team. Epoch Times, based in Vietnam, saw the story and sat down with the duo to record a show segment to broadcast in 15 countries.

Bruce Carrier, a member of St. Mark's, commented, "I have been so overwhelmed that this simple video of emotion and love between my grandson Felix and his Papa has received so much remarkable attention."





Books about George McGovern for George McGovern

St. Mark's is undertaking a project this fall to supply George McGovern Middle School (GMMS) with books about the school's namesake, George McGovern. In honor of McGovern's 100th birthday, St. Mark's will donate a copy of the book *George McGovern: South Dakota's Legendary Legislator* by Sarah Nearman Herbert to each of the 50 classrooms at GMMS. Additional copies will be a bonus for school staff to use for special projects or to welcome new families.

Herbert's book describes McGovern as an "ordinary kid" who grew up in Mitchell, SD, and went on to do extraordinary things at a national and international level.

St. Mark's has connected with GMMS for the past five years. Projects have included providing meals for staff during parent teacher conferences and delivering treats with cards of encouragement for the teachers.

A portion of the purchase price is being donated to Feeding South Dakota in honor of McGovern's 100th birthday. Fair Trade Tea and Coffee available

St. Mark's has restocked its supply of Fair Trade tea and coffee. Carts are in the narthex with a wooden box for payment.

Purchase of tea and coffee helps small farmers in some of the poorest countries of the world earn a fair price for their coffee. If you have a little extra change, it's a generous gesture to add that to the purchase price.

For years Lutheran World Relief (LWR) has helped coffee growers with farming techniques, helped farmers organize into cooperatives, helped them meet certification for Fair Trade, and helped market Fair Trade's products.

As Margaret Blume has said, "Drinking coffee is not a third Lutheran sacrament, but the good our coffee purchase does is certainly sacred."
