# Plan to Attend the Congregational Meeting October 7th or 8th

#### **Vote on the Part-time Associate Pastor Recommendation**

The Council has approved the recommendation of the Call Committee that St. Mark's Lutheran Church extend a call to Sawyer Vanden Heuvel for the position of part-time Associate Pastor.

The congregation will meet to vote by ballot on the recommendation on Saturday, October 7, after the 5:00 p.m. service and on Sunday, October 8, following the 8:30 a.m. and 10:45 am. services.

A process for members to vote electronically if not able to attend the meeting, is being developed.

Votes will be counted and results announced on Sunday. A twothirds majority is required.

If the vote passes, a Letter of Call will be extended. A congregation typically hears from the called candidate within 30 days.

# Food to You October 19

St. Mark's will serve at the *Food to You* grocery and personal products distribution on Thursday, October 19.

Location: Augustana Lutheran Church, 235 North Prairie Avenue.

#### Shifts and volunteers:

4:15 p.m. shift: 4-6 volunteers.

Volunteers will sort and count items which will include some lifting. It is helpful if some of the volunteers can lift 40-pound boxes. The 4:15 volunteers stay to help with distribution.

5:10 p.m. shift: 18-20 volunteers.

At least six of the volunteers should be able to lift and carry boxes. Volunteers will gather in the fellowship hall, downstairs at Augustana Lutheran for orientation and job assignments: offering groceries, greeting, helping with carry out. Youth are welcome to volunteer: One elementary age child per adult; middle and high school youth with adult helpers.

<u>To volunteer:</u> Call or email the office or sign up in the narthex.

**Food donations:** The October "Food of the Month" is cereal. The goal is for all guest households (about 100) to receive one to three boxes of cereal. Estimated need is at least 175-195 boxes. Cereal may be left at St. Mark's by Tuesday, October 17.

**Necessities**: Donations of toothpaste, shampoo and deodorant for hygiene packs and toilet paper any size are needed. Items may be left at St. Mark's by Tuesday, October 17.

**Minutes**: MSC to approve the August 15 Council minutes.

**Treasurer's Report**: MSC to approve the Treasurer's Report.

**Call Committee**: Dawn Hartigan presented the unanimous recommendation of the Call Committee to extend a call to Sawyer Vanden Heuvel for the position of part-time associate pastor. MSC that the council recommend the call to the congregation to be voted on at a special congregational meeting held on October 7 and 8 directly following each worship service. The council will work with Sawyer on compensation and mutual responsibilities as well as outline what is entailed in part-time expectations.

- Worship & Music: Gretchen Pederson's celebration has been planned for her last weekend, September 23 and 24.
- <u>Property:</u> The lawn has been reseeded. Plumbing fixes have been taken care of. All solicited bids for roof repair have been received, representing a range of estimates.

#### **New Business:**

- Christmas Eve falls on a Sunday this year. MSC to hold fourth weekend of Advent worship on Saturday evening, December 23 with no Sunday morning worship on December 24. Christmas Eve services will be held at 2:30, 5:30 and 10:30 p.m. There will be one 10:00 a.m. service on December 31.
- A request was received from Sharing the Dream, a project selling fair-trade handicrafts by Guatemalan artisans, for St. Mark's to host an event in December. It was decided to decline per our policy of not promoting fundraising for outside causes.
