Pastor's Letter

God with us

God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble.

-Psalm 46:1

We are hearing plenty of Christmas music in our cars, homes, stores, and as we attend concerts.

We hear lyrics like:

"It's the most wonderful time of the year"

"Tis the season to be jolly"

"O'er the fields we go laughing all the way"

"Have a holly jolly Christmas"

It's the best time of the year, but for many of us it is the most difficult time of the year. The days are so short and the nights seem to go on forever. Our grief seems to be right on the surface constantly, and we struggle with family issues, finances, and fear. Sometimes it can seem like way too much.

Enter the Christmas story. Jesus was born into a broken and violent world. The incarnation was not about tinsel, maxing out credit cards for gifts, or a picture perfect Christmas gathering. Our hymns name the reality:

"The hopes and fears of all the years are met in thee tonight" and

"O come, O come, Emmanuel, and ransom captive Israel that mourns in lonely exile here."

The promise we have in this vulnerable baby born in a cattle stall is that God enters into our brokenness, pain, grief, fear, and hopelessness. We are not expected to be cheery bright; we are only expected to be human. There was no need for Jesus to take on flesh, experience humanity, or love unconditionally if we could be good enough, strong enough, or even have enough faith.

So be confident this season to dance around your home singing "It's beginning to look a lot like Christmas," but also know that it is all right to be sad, angry, overwhelmed, fearful, and lost because we know that the dear Christ enters right into the midst of it all.

God with us is the promise of the season; the rest is just window dressing.

Liz Larson



Minutes: MSC to approve the October Council minutes with the addition of last month's designation of the Thanksgiving Offering for Pastor's Discretionary Fund.

Old Business:

The office staff will be meeting with Kevin Stillson to review his proposed redesign for St. Mark's website.

A question was raised regarding the recent piece in the *Servant* by the Reconciling in Christ Task Force. The Task Force was asked to review materials with Council before publication.

Treasurer's Report: Pledge cards and Time & Talent sheets are out. We are somewhat behind budget in income. The 2023 proposed budget will be brought to Council in December.

New Business:

During Advent, people will have the opportunity to fill piggy banks for ELCA Alternative Gifts/ World Hunger.

MSC to spend this year's Local Benevolence \$1500 line item on our relationship with McGovern Middle School, including a meal for staff, student treats, and gift cards for food over Christmas break.

MSC to designate half of the Christmas Offering for Pastor's Discretionary Fund and half for Feeding South Dakota.

The Nominating Committee will be beginning their work soon.

The date of the Annual Meeting was set for January 29.
